# **Historical Sites**

### Creake Abbey

Dating from the 13th Century, Creake Abbey is home to historical ruins of a former Augustinian church. Beyond its rich heritage, the site offers an award-winning farmers market (held the first Saturday of every month), a café serving light lunches and afternoon tea, and an array of independent shops. The deli sells fresh meat, cheese, and other local produce, whilst you can also enjoy local wines and ales.

Dog-friendly and family-oriented, the Abbey features a children's sandpit and toy tractors. Several lovely walks are available, including a trail to a viewpoint overlooking Burnham Overy Staithe and its harbour, as well as cycling routes. The fields opposite the car park are known for their diverse bird population.

#### Holkham Hall

This magnificent 18th-century country house sits at the heart of a 25,000-acre estate and is recognised as one of England's ten most magnificent palaces. Visitors can explore the impressive Marble Hall, Statue Gallery, Chapel, and many other historic rooms. The Holkham Stories Experience offers insights into the estate's history.

The grounds feature a walled garden with Victorian greenhouses, extensive parkland, a large fountain, outdoor theatre, restaurant, and gift shop. Picnics are welcome in Holkham Park, and children will enjoy the Woodland play area. The estate hosts a free parkrun every Saturday, and daily nature walks are available. For unique experiences, book a tractor trailer tour or try the ropes course with zip wires. Boat hire and special activities are offered throughout the year.

## Houghton Hall

This beautiful Palladian Mansion from the 1700s was built for Britain's First Prime Minister, Sir Robert Walpole. The Hall is surrounded by extensive parkland and offers numerous attractions including the awardwinning Walled Garden with its spectacular double-sided herbaceous border, Italian garden, formal rose parterre, fruit and vegetable gardens, glasshouse, rustic temple, antique statues, and fountains.

Contemporary sculptures feature throughout the grounds, including works by world-renowned artists. From April to October 2023, Sean Scully is staging a major exhibition of outdoor sculptures, paintings, and works on paper. Military history enthusiasts will appreciate the Model Soldier Museum, which houses the world's largest private collection of model soldiers. The Stables Café provides refreshments, and the Gift Shop offers a wide range of souvenirs.

#### The Ostrich Inn

A fixture in South Creake since 1841, this recently renovated inn serves lunch and dinner Monday to Saturday, plus Sunday lunches. Using fresh local ingredients, their wood-fired pizzas on the terrace are particularly recommended. The bar offers a range of beers on tap and an interesting international wine selection curated by their in-house sommelier.



#### Socius

Winner of Restaurant of the Year (England), Socius is renowned for small plates and sharing dishes.
Their seasonally changing menu features modern dishes made with locally sourced ingredients. Enjoy innovative cuisine in an open-plan dining area with a relaxed atmosphere, perfect for sharing amongst friends and family.



#### The White Horse Norfolk

Located on the beach at
Brancaster Staithe, this personal
favourite offers seafood
specialities like smoked fish and
oyster tempura. While seafood is
their forte, non-seafood options
are also available, all prepared
with fresh, local produce. Dine in
their award-winning conservatory
restaurant, bar area, terrace,
courtyard, or book a Marshside
table for stunning views.

For an exceptional culinary experience, visit Morston Hall, which offers a Michelin-starred seven-course tasting menu that changes daily (reservation required). This UK Top 100 Restaurant also serves four-course Sunday lunches and afternoon teas of exemplary standard, complemented by excellent wines and exclusive Morston Hall Tailored Gin.

#### Casual Dining

The Burnhams Tea Room and Café, hidden in Burnham Market's main square, serves delicious home-baked scones, cakes, sandwiches, and light lunches using locally sourced ingredients. Tilly's Café, the longest-running café in Burnham Market, is known for friendly service and homemade baked goods, including gluten-free and vegan options.

#### Seafood Specialists

Gurneys Fish Shop offers the finest locally produced smoked fish, shellfish, and freshly caught fish. With over 40 years of experience, Mike Gurney serves everything from shrimp and lobster to crab and mussels, either fresh or prepared as soup, pie, chowder, pâté, and more. The shop also sells a variety of fresh seafood caught on the North Norfolk coast.

# Charming Market Towns

Burnham Market (8 minutes' drive)

Known as "Chelsea on Sea" for its chic boutiques and vibrant atmosphere, this charming village offers excellent shopping and dining. Notable establishments include The Nelson pub, Arthur Howell's traditional butcher, Burnhams Tea Room, Gurneys Fish Shop, Tilly's Café, and Humble Pie Delicatessen. The village also features a petrol station, fishmonger, greengrocer, post office with cash point, clothing shops, art galleries, and more.

The weekly market occurs every Wednesday, while the annual Burnham Market Craft Fair takes place on the third Thursday in August. Surrounded by stunning coastal paths, the area is perfect for walking and cycling, with bike hire available at Burnham Cycles. Nearby Holkham Estate offers varied landscapes and wildlife.

## Wells-next-the-Sea (15 minutes' drive)

This popular seaside town boasts miles of unspoilt beaches and sand dunes. Wells Harbour is a bustling hub during summer months, home to fishing boats, pleasure craft, and wildlife. It's a popular spot for crabbing, with supplies available from shops on the harbour front. Wells Harbour Tour offers one-hour trips exploring the harbour, beach, and salt marsh.

The Norfolk Coast Path runs along the entire coast for exploration on foot. Visitors can enjoy sailing, windsurfing, kayaking, bird watching, or simply relaxing on the beach. The Lookout atop Lady Anne's Drive offers spectacular views over Holkham National Nature Reserve and has its own café. The town features several shops and cafes, including a greengrocer, bakeries, taverns, and fish shops offering some of the finest fish and chips on the coast.

#### Little Walsingham (10 minutes' drive)

This rural village situated in lush Norfolk countryside boasts a stunning collection of rare medieval buildings, Georgian facades, an 18th-century model prison, and a Russian Orthodox church in an old railway station. Guided tours are available for those interested in the rich history of Walsingham. The Wells & Walsingham Light Railway offers transport to Wells-next-the-Sea beach.

Food enthusiasts should visit Walsingham Farms Shop for the best of local North Norfolk produce, including wellhung aged Walsingham beef, pork, and lamb from nearby South Creake, home-made sausages, and home-cured bacon. Their open kitchen prepares home-cooked ready meals, soups, cakes, and desserts, complemented by locally brewed beers, ciders, local gins, and Norfolk wines. 2 — Fakenham (10 minutes' drive)

This traditional market town features extensive shops, restaurants, and a lively atmosphere. Home to Fakenham Racecourse and historic buildings including the Grade I listed Town Hall and Grade II listed Market Cross, visitors can explore the town's rich history via the Lancaster Heritage Trail. Activities include bowling at Fakenham Superbowl, escape rooms, cinema, mini golf at Fakenham Fairways, and golfing at Fakenham Golf Club.

Convenient amenities include a petrol station and Waitrose at the A148 roundabout, plus Tesco, Morrison's, Aldi, Lidl, Argos, and M&S for more extensive shopping. The area is well-served by banks and a post office.

Holt (30 minutes' drive)

This historic Georgian town is surrounded by beautiful parks and close to the stunning coast. Adventure seekers can visit the Hilltop Outdoor Centre, which offers thrilling activities during school holidays including the Air Jump, The Big Zipper, Super Swing, Climbing Wall, Archery, and Tree Top Trail.

Holt is situated in stunning countryside with plenty of trails for walking or cycling to enjoy woodland and sea views, nature, and archaeology. Spout Hills, a green space with diverse wildlife, is a short walk from Holt High Street.

Natural Surroundings offers a unique Wildlife Garden with café, nursery, and Nature Reserve in the Glaven Valley, featuring 18 wildlife-friendly demonstration gardens open Tuesday to Sunday.

# **Pristine Beaches**

The North Norfolk coast is renowned for its stunning beaches, each with its own unique character and charm. From vast expanses of golden sand to sheltered coves, these beaches offer something for everyone, whether you're seeking relaxation, water sports, or wildlife watching.

#### Holkham Beach

At low tide, the beach stretches for miles, creating a breathtaking landscape perfect for long walks. The beach is part of the Holkham National Nature Reserve, making it an excellent spot for wildlife enthusiasts.

#### Wells-next-the-Sea Beach

Located just 15 minutes from
South Creek, Wells Beach is
famous for its row of colourful
beach huts and shallow channels
that fill with water as the tide
comes in. The beach is sandy and
flat, making it ideal for beach
walks, and during low tide, it's
perfect for rock pooling. The sea
near the pier attracts many
surfers, and the Norfolk Coast
Path runs along the entire coast,
offering visitors the chance to
explore the area on foot.

#### Brancaster Beach

A 20-minute drive from South
Creek, Brancaster Beach offers
natural dunes and vast expanses
of sand, ideal for dog walking,
swimming, and kitesurfing. The
beach is part of the Norfolk Coast
Area of Outstanding Natural
Beauty and provides stunning
views across the North Sea. At low
tide, you can see the remains of
the SS Vina shipwreck, though
visitors are advised not to
approach it due to dangerous
tides.







### Wildlife Watching

The North Norfolk Coast offers diverse bird habitats, supporting large numbers of wintering and migrating wildfowl and waders, in addition to resident bird populations. RSPB Titchwell Marsh Nature Reserve provides big skies, a sandy beach, and bird-filled reedbeds, lagoons, and marshes.

#### Water Activities

For those looking for more adventure, the beaches offer excellent opportunities for sailing, windsurfing, and kayaking.

Brancaster Staithe is a thriving location for the local fishing industry and popular for sailing. Branta

Cruises offers boat trips operating daily from Brancaster Staithe

Harbour.

# Crabbing

Wells Harbour is a popular spot for crabbing, with multiple shops on the harbour front offering supplies. At Gilly Gut on the Quay, you can hire re-usable metal buckets and ecofriendly tackle for a sustainable crabbing experience that children particularly enjoy.

Other notable beaches within easy reach include Thornham (25 minutes' drive), which is popular with visitors seeking peace and quiet in a natural setting, and Cromer Beach (40 minutes' drive), which is sandy and flat, making it great for beach walks. During low tide, Cromer Beach is perfect for rock pooling, and the sea near the pier attracts many surfers. The high cliffs are rich in fossils dating back to the Pleistocene era and support Cromer Lighthouse.

Prices start from £4 per game per person, open from 11am Thursday to Sunday during school term and daily during school holidays.

#### Fakenham Escape Rooms

Test your problem-solving skills and teamwork at Fakenham Escape Rooms, which offers various exciting themes including prison cells, dungeons, and space. Each room presents unique puzzles and riddles to solve within a time limit. Choose to receive hints or attempt the experience without assistance like the professionals. 
